Weed Abatement is still only costs \$100 per calendar year. For our newer homeowners, Carriage Manor provides an annual weed abatement service. We do not guarantee you will never have a weed (that's not very realistic) but we do go out to each lot monthly and if you find weeds in between, just call and we will quickly take care of it for you. This is the perfect option for our winter residents and full-time residents who don't fancy pulling weeds in 110° heat.

Do you have Renters coming in for the winter? Please make sure I have your 3rd Party agreements and \$25 Homeowner Admin fee here in the office for all renters at least 1 week in advance of their arrival and earlier if possible. Also, make sure you always write your lot numbers on the check for your HOA payments, this assures that your payments are applied correctly to your lot account.

ARC

A reminder from the Architectural Review Committee, commonly known as ARC.

ARC members are owners/residents who are appointed by, and responsible to, the Board of Directors, and the committee is a State of Arizona requirement for HOAs. We oversee changes that owners make to the outside of their homes and property, such as renovations, additions and landscaping. As well, we attend when new homes come into the park to ensure they are located on the lot as per the design guidelines.

Almost all work done on the exterior of your home and property will need a permit.

If you're unsure if the work you plan to do needs a permit, please ask at the office. They will contact us, and we will get an answer to you. We will come and visit you to discuss your project if necessary. We are willing and available to answer your questions about the work you intend to do, in regards to conformance to Carriage Manor's published Design Guidelines and Rules & Regulations.

To get a permit, please go to the office and fill out an application form. ARC members process the applications early Mondays and Thursdays, so there is generally a short turnaround time between application and permit issue.

Secondly, you have to pick up the permit in the office. We don't deliver them.

Next, please display the permit (a green sheet) prominently before starting work. If work is being done on your home and a permit is not visible, you may get a visit from Security or Carriage Manor's Compliance Officer because somebody reported you.

Finally, remember to return the permit to the office when the work is complete, so we know it's done. Your project may or may not be inspected by ARC personnel or the Compliance Officer, depending on the type and scope of work being done.

Thanks for doing these things. And thank you for helping us to keep Carriage Manor an attractive place to live.

Hello and Welcome Back!

It's so great to see all your smiling faces return to Carriage Manor. The weather has been great, the sun is shining, and I see a lot of you out getting your places all set up for the coming season.

Along those lines, I want to give you a few household reminders to think about checking on your units.

- 1. Change out all the air filters. They get really dirty and clogged which will ruin your heating and cooling system.
- 2. Clean your gutters on your unit. Dirty gutters will result in the downspouts getting clogged and then the water will back up into your shed or house causing water damage. Termites are attracted to wood and wet wood plus water damage creates mold which can make you sick.
- 3. Look for any water damage on your ceilings which may have been from our monsoon storms. Water spots are a red flag to check your roof

and any potential Buyer's.

- 4. It's always a good idea to have your HVAC (heating & cooling) system checked out and serviced by a licensed company. Keep the receipts, it's always good to show those to Buyers.
- 5. Check for water leaks under your unit. Older units may still have polybutylene pipes which have a tendency to leak. Leaks cause damage on several levels; warped floors, mold, termites, warping floor joists, etc.

These items show up frequently on Home Inspection Reports.
