# **PHYSICAL PHACTS**

Maintaining equipment and/or a property is much easier by performing scheduled PM's and services than taking the 'fireman' approach to repairs, by chasing every concern and worry. Although emergencies do happen and one must drop what they're doing, it is much better for all parties to remain vigilant in creating and following a schedule. In the long run, it is just better to put a 'Work Order' in.

In the spirit of creating schedules the Maintenance Team has worked hard for the past year and a half to make Thursday our water day. On this day you'll find that the water gets turned off anytime between 8 and noon. We do this for 2 reasons: First, we are not perfect and notices do not always have time to get distributed before repairs. Secondly, if is just better to create a PM type schedule, so all can plan accordingly. To help remedy some concerns that are expressed the Maintenance Team has put procedures in place that also allow us to turn water off, change valves, and turn water back on in a shorter period of time. We have found that the less impart to the Residents means less 'fireman' type repairs. Changing the old type 'gate valve' out to a newer type 'ball valve' is a much quicker process and we currently try to schedule 3-4 a week.

Now changing out the whole stand pipe requires digging up yards, impacting much more to get down to the 'Main Water Line' and replace the entire riser supply line that feeds each home. Many times we utilize the Resorts small excavator which does make it faster but creates a bigger mess. Even with this type of repair we go to extreme measure to cause the least amount of discomfort to the residents. We average between 30 to 75 hours on these types of repairs. The variables are how deep we dig, how far we dig, obstacles in the way and how much finished landscaping there is to re-install. Depending on our work load and other projects we try and do 2 a month.

Now if one were to do the math, one would see that the schedules and procedures are not only important to the organization of the repairs but create a standard to 'win the race'. Although slow it becomes steady. As always we applaud your patience and understanding.





### 50 First Dates

#### Speed Dating



Is the dating scene got you and your single friends longing for the days of arranged marriages? Even with the many dating services and apps that are out there, finding the perfect match isn't always easy, especially if this is the second time around. Singles looking to meet a special person without the help of your well-meaning friends and social media, speed dating events could hold the answer.

Speed dating has been around since 1999, when Rabbi Yaacov Deyo and several of his single students put a new twist on the longstanding Jewish tradition of introducing young Jewish singles to one another at chaperoned gatherings. At a speed dating event, participants are paired up in a series of quick five- to seven-minute "dates." When the time is up, a bell or timer is rung, and participants move on to their next one-on-one conversation.

While seven minutes may not seem long enough to determine whether a new acquaintance is a potential match, it gives participants plenty of time to gauge their level of interest or get a feeling that the other person is just not the right fit. As an added bonus, the round-robin setup enables participants to meet more potential matches in one evening than they might otherwise encounter in a month or more of traditional dating.

As with any first date, the object of a speed date is to determine if the person sitting across from you is someone you'd like to know better. The difference is that you have just seven minutes to make that decision (and to make a good impression on your date), so skip the small talk and start with the questions that matter most to you, like "What's your favorite breakfast cereal to eat for dinner?" or "Star Wars or Star Trek?" A series of 5-minute interactions or "dates" will allow you to sum up your interest.

Daters can keep track of new acquaintances they meet on a comment card. Comment cards are kept confidential and turned into the host at the end of the event. If (and only if!) there is a mutual interest, the host will share contact information with the other interested party. Helps take the pressure off, right?

Carriage Manor is teaming up with several communities in the East Valley to connect you with other singles; this event is for men and women to meet. The plan is to rotate which community hosts the event so depending on which event you sign up for will determine its location. Transportation is on your own.

We're looking for singles open to a new experience in dating - 5 males and 5 females. Please note we're limited to include only even numbers for male/female ratio (i.e., cannot bring 5 male and only 2 female), so be aware that uneven registrants may be dropped from the event.

#### How do we define "Guest"?

This is an issue that the Board of Directors is currently grappling with and we'd appreciate your input.

#### The current definition in R&R 1.3 reads:

An adult who resides with a resident or in a unit with permission of that unit's owner.

No rent may be charged. Limited to two adults per residence. Children are considered guests but will not be counted in the complement. All guests shall be registered at the Main Desk.

What are the possible problems with this definition?

Based on the current wording, it would give permission for any adult to reside in a unit belonging to an owner who is absent. This could have unintended consequences of allowing two 18-year-old people to have free reign for up to 14 days with no supervision.

It could allow renters to work around the 28-day minimum stay by calling them "guests". As it was pointed out in the last board meeting, we have a lot of major events held in the Phoenix area. It doesn't seem fair to have some renters with lower scruples to rent out their unit for a weekend by calling them "guests".

The pure definition of guest in Websters Dictionary is: (a) a person entertained in one's house. (b) a person to whom hospitality is extended. (c) a person who pays for the service of an establishment (such as a hotel or restaurant).

The implied meaning of a guest is that the person is coming to be with YOU, not just have free reign of your vacant house.

#### Some suggested options are:

**Guest (hosted in owner's unit with owner on-site)**: No rent may be charged. An adult who resides with a resident or in owner's second unit. Limited to two adults per residence. Children are considered guests but will not be counted in the complement. All guests shall be registered at the Front Desk.

This is pretty straight forward and shouldn't cause any problems.

**Guest (hosted in owner's unit, owner off-site)**: An adult who resides in a unit with permission of that unit's owner. No rent may be charged. Limited to two adults per residence. Children are considered guests but will not be counted in the complement. All guests shall be registered at the Front Desk.

Here we have the situation of giving up the owner's unit to someone with no supervision, which could be a problem if the "guests" are quite young.

Question: should there be an age limit fitting with our 55+ community? Suggestions have been made to have this be 40 or older to conform with our current regulations.

Should this be allowed at all?

Guest (owner off-site and hosted by another on-site resident, either in their unit or secondary unit they own). No rent may be charged. Limited to two adults per residence. Children are considered guests but will not be counted in the complement. All guests shall be registered at the Front Desk.

This would be a situation where the owner is absent, but a friend or neighbor is willing to accept the responsibility for them and house them in one of their units. Any penalties would still be charged to the owner, not the person standing in for them.


This will be discussed in the next work session on September 14th and again October 14<sup>th</sup>.
