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PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Welcome back!! It's that time of the year when we are glad to welcome back our winter visitors. For those that were in residence all summer it has been a HOT summer and these recent cool spells have been a welcome change.

One of the larger projects this summer has been tackled by a sub-committee of the Long Range Planning team. Following is a summary of the development of this project:

HISTORY/TIMELINE

- BOD requested a strategic plan be developed for Carriage Manor and tasked LRP to do this
- Survey was sent to residents in the summer of 2018..responses taken thru October 2018
- Responses tabulated and interest in the development of Patriot Park was #2 on the wish/request list for future planning of Carriage Manor
- BOD action last year to create an AD-HOC committee (broad-based committee) to explore the potential development ideas for Patriot Park
- AD-HOC committee presented their ideas and BOD moved to turn the idea of development over to LRP
- LRP created a sub-committee (largely the former members of the AD-HOC committee), ideas were submitted to On Point Architecture and Caruso Construction
- Summer of 2019 plans were revised and scaled back. Committee drafted its proposal to be presented to LRP in September
- LRP adopted their Committee's proposal and set in motion the step to move to BOD adoption of the plan

PROPOSAL:

• This will be a 3-phase project for several reasons: Large project in scope

Currently a "boom market" in the construction industry...future markets may be less expensive

Spread the cost of the project for residents over 3 assessments... individuals able to budget better for the assessment when spread from 2020 to 2024.

- Additional funding for this project represents "shared funding"... the use of our Capital Improvement fund...monies that represent new owners investing in the amenities of the resort, fundraising efforts of individuals and clubs
- The project includes areas and spaces for a wide variety of interests... bocce ball, pickleball, pet owners, resident-friendly gathering places

Finally, the VALUE we all share in Carriage Manor today is because those before led the way in developing the amenities of our resort. The Patriots Park Enhancement Project is our opportunity to do the same. More information will be available at upcoming workshops and board meetings as well as "town hall" type of meetings. The Board of Directors supports this project and encourages all residents to attend these events and join us with your support.

As I have mentioned several times in the past, this Board is committed to the sharing of more information with our residents, and during several of our upcoming weekly Wednesday morning coffee programs we will be presenting short presentations on various subjects of interest, as well as various committee activities, etc.

Carriage Manor's Rain Water Retention System

In the desert, all developed areas are required to have retention areas that hold rain water from its properties for a period of 36 hours, meanwhile allowing it to drain slowly into the city's storm canals like those at our west wall. These retention areas must be of an adequate size to hold the water from a 3" rainfall. All of this was determined by engineers at the time the development was planned.

CM has several retention areas. A major one runs along the south and west side of the tennis courts and the entire west side of our main building including the horseshoe and shuffleboard court areas. These areas receive the rain water from the northern part of CM.

Our largest retention area is the one located in the SW corner of CM known as Patriot Park, which generally handles rain water from the areas south of the activity center. For some historic reason, it was built larger than was necessary for water retention fortunately allowing CM to use the excess capacity for development of various kinds such as the current pickleball courts. It also gives CM the opportunity to plan for the future development of Patriot Park.

Meanwhile we hear concerns from a few folks about the system. Will the water ever come over the berms? Dave Wright, our previous property manager for 18 years, said that the highest water level he ever saw in Patriot Park was about halfway up the berm.

Do the water levels cause any damage.? Our current property manager, who has been here a number of years, has experienced none.

When water covers the various courts, is any damage done? No. Current concrete suffers no damage from standing water and actually makes concrete

stronger. Larger concrete areas such as tennis and pickleball courts are constructed with post-tension cables throughout the slab adding additional strength.

Would a building suffer damage from the water? Yes. Any building, or even a parking lot placed in a retention area would need to be built 4 feet off the ground so it is above high water, which is why the proposed plan does not include a building in the retention area.

In conclusion, high water levels during a monsoon are normal and do no damage. We may see a plastic chair float by but that is a minor problem. And we can take comfort knowing that our system is working well as it was designed when CM was developed.

NOTE: This article was prepared to address some concerns which appeared after our last monsoon rain and hopefully gives people adequate information to understand how our system works. By Willie Heinrich, chair of Patriot Park Planning Committee.

They will be in the Clubhouse lobby between 8:30-10:30 am.

- 4. We still offer the Arizona Republic Newspaper at the lowest rates available. Please come up to the front desk to place your order.
- 5. Are you planning to rent your property this season? Remember you must turn in a Third-Party Agreement along with the \$25 Homeowner fee (See Governing Documents R&R 12.21) to the Admin office at least 1 week prior to your renter arriving. (Third Party Agreements are available in the Admin Office or on our website, CarriageManorResort.com in the forms tab.)

Also, please let your renter know they need to check in with us, show valid ID to verify age and there is a \$10 per person resort fee plus.

6. Have you moved in the past year or so? Please remember to update your addresses and if you have more than one property, make sure we are aware to update all your properties. Also, if AZ is now your permanent address, please tell us to remove your old addresses from our system.

R & R 12.16 Contractors Hours of Work: Except for emergencies approved by the Security Chief, the time limit for contractors working in the park shall be as follows:

Monday – Saturday from April 15th to October 15th contractors will be permitted to work in the park between 7:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. only, and from October 16th to April 14th contractor will be permitted to work in the park between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. only. (June 14, 2017)

I would like to reiterate... please call ahead to allow a contractor to enter the resort to complete repairs and/or additions to your respective residences. It assists in the entry rather than holding the contractor until the security department locates a resident.

quarter turn back. This gives you a little play if the valve becomes stuck.

- 2. Some of you have the new ball valves we've been installing. If you do just turn it all the way on.
- 3. Check to see if you have a Back Flow Preventer on your water system. This will stop water from siphoning out of your hot water heater preventing possible damage to your hot water heater.

These helpful tips will ensure you water system will work well this season. Thank you,


