MANAGER'S MESSAGE

Where to begin, lots of changes, I'll start with recycling. The City of Mesa now services our recycling, the location of the bins has not changed, nor has recycling day, which is the entire resort every Wednesday. However the items that can be placed in bins has expanded to now include glass and recycling items can be co-mingled. The most important thing to remember with this new program.....NO KITCHEN TRASH in recycling bins. We will be charged additional fees if residential kitchen trash is found in recycling bins. Please find details on recycling program on next page.

Wednesday Coffee hour at 8:00AM in the Social Hall will begin October 16, 2019, we are going old school on this and reminding everyone to please bring your own coffee cup in order to decrease costs of styro-foam cups.

The Patio Grille will be opening Monday, November 4, 2019 with Jerry Combs as our cook and John Murray back as dishwasher. Glad no changes there, as I found them both to be very successful in finishing up last season. In fact, last season was an exercise in trial and error on many components, and I assure you we will continue to have our standard menu as well as Daily breakfast and lunch specials. While we are always tweaking things in terms of customer feedback there are no changes projected in the Patio Grille for this season.

We do have several changes coming to the Administrative Offices this season, one which includes Lorri Blankenship moving into Realty. Did you know Lorri first came to CM in the realty office and then returned when a position was open in Administration? Kathy Sipley, our Sales Director for CMRE has decided this will be her last season and actually retire. So, Lorri will be working with Kathy this season in preparation to take over as Sales Director at the end of the 2019/2020 season. Shauna Smith will continue providing Designated Broker responsibilities to CMRE. Shauna, Lorri, Kathy and I are all excited to see Lorri's success in this new role.

Paper

Includes computer/writing paper, Junk mail, catalogs, phone books, newspaper, magazines & paper bags



Plastic Bottles, Cups & Containers

Includes cups, laundry & shampoo bottles, berry clamshell containers, margarine tubs and yogurt/plastic containers



Milk & Juice Cartons

Includes ice cream cartons & juice boxes



Cardboard & Paperboard

Includes cereal, soda, laundry detergent & other paperboard boxes Remove liners & any plastic wrap Break down large boxes



Metal Cans

Food & beverage cans only includes pet food cans, aluminum foil, aluminum pie plates, etc.



Glass Bottles & Jars

Food & beverage containers only

Why should I recycle? Does it really make a difference?

Yes! For every ton of material recycled, the City of Mesa receives revenue which goes into the City's general fund. This helps to support many of the services provided by the City of Mesa such as parks, libraries, street maintenance and emergency response services. On the flip side, the City of Mesa pays a disposal fee for every ton of material that is buried in the landfill.

My plastic bags say they are recyclable. Why can't I place them in the recycle bin?

Plastic bags and plastic wrap get tangled in the machines used to sort recyclables which slows down the sorting process and damages the equipment. Instead you should recycle them at your local retailer so they can bypass the sorting sustem.

Why can't I bag my recyclables in plastic or paper bags? Recyclables should be dry, relatively clean, loose and not bagged when placed in the recycle bin. Collected material is sorted at a rate of up to 25 tons per hour and unfortunately staff cannot open or empty bags due to the risk of possibly contaminating loose recyclables with unknown or non-accepted material such as food, animal waste, diapers or yard trimmings. Bagged material will be pulled from the sorting line and sent to the landfill.

What if I place non-acceptable items in the recycle bin?

Placing non-acceptable items such as Styrofoam, plastic bags, clothing, yard waste or any other items listed on the back of this flyer in the recycle bin can jeopardize Mesa's recycling efforts. Under the City of Mesa's recycling contract, the vendor reserves the right to refuse contaminated loads or impose substantial penalty fees so please remember to only recycle the items listed above. Non-Accepted items

Unfortunately, some things are not recyclable due to their specific composition or form OR cannot be recycled in Mesa's recycle bin due to the limitations of the sorting process at the materials recovery facility. And while intentions might be good, placing non-acceptable items in the recycle bin causes more harm than good. Nonacceptable items lower the value of accepted materials as well as can damage the sorting equipment.



Bagged Recyclables

Due to unknown contents, bagged recyclables will be landfilled to avoid contaminating other material. Items should instead be loose, dry, empty and relatively clean.



Pet Food Bags

These bags are typically made of different components such as paper, plastic and/or wax lining which can't be separated for recycling.





Foam Products

Cups, take out containers, plates, packing material, etc. (There is no current market for these types of



Pouches

Coffee & liquid soap refill bags, baby food & drink pouches, etc. (Pouches have different material layers which can't be separated for recycling.)





Specialized Glass & Ceramics

Window & auto glass, lightbulbs, bakeware, drinkware, mirrors, tile, picture frame glass, etc. (Due to their specific use, these items contain additives and can't be recycled with regular glass.)

Lumber & Yard Waste

Grass, branches, plywood, etc. (Yard waste can be composted at home or by participating in Mesa's Green Barrel Program.)





Hoses & Cords

Garden hoses, light strands, extension cords, strapping material, etc. (These items get tangled in the sorting equipment.)



Textiles

Clothes, shoes, rags, linens, rugs, etc. (These items can be taken to your local donation center.)





Plastic Bags & Wrap*

Plastic bags, bread/produce bags, storage bags, tarps, case wrap (bottled water, paper towels, bathroom tissue), shrink wrap, soft plastic packaging, etc. (This material gets tangled in the sorting equipment.)



Food Waste

Food waste can be composted at home to produce fertilizer.





Wire Hangers & Scrap Metal

Appliances, electronics, batteries, pots & pans, auto parts, etc. (These items damage the sorting equipment. Contact a local scrap metal recycler for available options.)





Paper Plates & **Napkins**

Paper towels, facial tissue, greasy pizza boxes, etc. (Paper items that are dirty and/or greasy eliminates their ability to be recycled.)

- 1. Remember to put in a change of address with your post office BEFORE you head back here for the season.
- 2. When you arrive, stop by the office to check in and open your mailbox.
- 3. If you will be needing high-speed internet access (no contract required), contact CenturyLink at 888-285-6808. (Make sure you give them the Carriage Manor referral code: 356793.) If you will be arriving during the peak months of December or January, they recommend you contact them early to guarantee your startup date.
- 4. We still offer the Arizona Republic Newspaper at the lowest rates available. Please come up to the front desk to place your order.
- 5. Are you planning to rent your property this season?
 Remember you must turn in a Third-Party Agreement along with the \$25 Homeowner fee (See Governing Documents R&R 12.21) to the Admin office at least 1 week prior to your renter arriving. (Third Party Agreements are available in the Admin Office or on our website at CarriageManorResort.com in the forms tab.)
- 6. Also, please let your renter know they need to check in with us, show valid ID to verify age and there is a \$10 per person resort fee.

Have you moved in the past year or so? Please remember to update your addresses and if you have more than one property, make sure I'm aware to update all your properties. Also, if AZ is now your permanent address, please tell me to remove your old addresses from our system.

REAL ESTATE ROUNDUP

Fall has arrived with a splash (lots of rain) and now it's time for you all to come back! We've missed you so come on down and see everything that has been done while you've been gone!

If you have looked at what we currently have For Sale, you will notice we do not have many. Our Resort is beautiful, well run, great proximity to everything, land owned, and the best security. All these things make Carriage Manor in high demand, and with that prices have risen. I do my best when listing your park models to cover all of this with the owners and will give market comparisons to help validate listing prices. If there have been upgrades which add value, it may list and sell for more than one that hasn't had any improvements. I point these in-demand upgrades out to Sellers I meet with when they consider how to price it accordingly. One thing to consider is rising prices sound nice, but they do put Carriage Manor out of some prospects buying power range.

I do have one caution when you put the higher asking price on older units. I know sellers would like to sell for the highest price possible, but in order to do so, the buyer needs to see and realize the value in the higher listing price. If you have an older unit that has not had any current upgrades/updates (in the last 10 years or less), still has older/original roofing, water heater, HVAC (heating & AC), furniture, polybutylene pipes, old windows and window treatments (blinds), appliances, shows evidence of more than normal wear and tear, ceiling damage from roof leaks/water damage, termite damage, mold...... It is a hard sell to tell the buyer it's a "decent unit for the price" when all they're seeing is money they must spend on repairs and cleaning to get the unit "in shape".

If you are thinking of selling, you can take the initiative and have a pre-inspection done, which would put you ahead of the buyers' home inspector. Any items that are revealed could be remedied ahead of time or the listing price could be based on the revealed defects with the intent that the buyer would remediate them, and not you. We do get a few buyers that are looking for "project" units to work on, so these types would be a great opportunity for them. Otherwise a home inspection can (and does) give buyers a reason to cancel the purchase. If a buyers' home inspection reveals defects, damage and areas of concern to the point of cancelling, going forward all of that will have to be disclosed by the seller to all other future buyers. Again, it is difficult for buyers to see the value if the listing price is high no matter what the "demand" is.

Hello! Hope all is well. As your packing up to head back to your Southern home it's time to revisit the trash rules here at the Manor.

There are 4 GRAY RECYCLE dumpsters here in the resort. 2 are located by employee parking in front of Shuffleboard. The other 2 are located on the north side of the tennis courts.

You can recycle PLASTIC BOTTLES, MILK JUGS, and STEEL SOUP CANS CEREIAL BOXES, PAPER PRODUCTS, CARDBOARD BOXES (broken down) NEWS PAPERS, ETC.

RECYCLE WILL **NOT** TAKE... STYROFOAM, SCRAP METAL, PLASTIC BAGS. PLEASE DO NOT PUT KITCHEN TRASH IN RECYCLE. Doing so makes the thankless job of the sanitation transfer pro's harder as they have to try and dig out the trash that doesn't belong. If you are unsure what's legal just stop by the office for guidance.

THE BIG GREEN DUMPSTER is for tree branches, old lawn furniture, stuff that came out of your shed.

Last but not least. THE TAN COMPACTOR. This is for kitchen trash only. COFFEE GROUNDS, EGG SHELLS, OLD FRUIT, USED PAPER TOWELS. The stuff in your kitchen trash can.

Don't forget if you get new furniture and the old is in good shape please call one of the donation stores and they will come pick it up.

Arc Comunittee News

As we begin thinking about returning to our AZ resort, I wanted to take this time to give you an update to the Design Guidelines so you can get right to work on some of those desired projects upon your return to the Manor.

As you may be aware, in the March 2019 BOD meeting, several changes to our **Design Guidelines** were approved by the BOD. I'd like to bring those changes to light here. Please note that these changes along with any changes/improvements to the outside of your property require approval by ARC.

Lot Line Fences:

The key issue is that no permanent wall or fence can be erected that inhibits the ability of authorized workers access to the rear of your property when needed. To accommodate this the guidelines were changed to allow a 3 to 5 ft gate to cross the 5 ft setback but must remain readily accessible for those authorized.

Vinyl Storage Shed/Chests:

We all seem to need more storage than we thought so to allow that extra storage and maintain the beauty of our resort, the following changes were made:

Vinyl sheds are allowed. There is a limit of 2, with dimensions of no more than 4 ½ ft. wide by 2 ½ ft. deep by 7 ft. high. They must be located to the rear of park model or AZ room facing toward the rear property line and there must remain at least 2 ½ ft. between the shed and the lot line for access. Although they may not be permanently attached, you may restrain them with an easily removable device (strap or similar device) to keep them from blowing away during weather occurrences.

♦ Just a reminder, the green Verification of Permit form that you display in the window during the project must be returned at the completion of the project to ARC.




