MANAGER'S MESSAGE

It's a challenge to write this mid-February for next month's edition knowing the end of March begins the exodus of many of you. Those of you who are not year round residents, will begin making plans for your departure back to your summer homes, and I would like to remind you to include the care of your Carriage Manor home while you are away as part of your planning. In years past there was the perception that everyone went away for the summer, and care of the individual properties was kind of out of sight out of mind. Now, we have many new as well as longtime residents that have chosen Carriage Manor as their year round home. They have made it clear to me their expectation of the Governing Documents being enforced year round. This means they expect the residents who are winter visitors to keep their lots weed free, with trees and bushes being kept trimmed.

In reviewing the Governing Documents, I must acknowledge the Governing Documents do not make reference to its CC&R's being suspended during the summer months. Inevitably, from time to time, properties become out of compliance. When this happens, the association informs residents about the problem and follows what is known as our due process prior to taking any action.

- The property owner is sent a friendly written notice (we really do try to be as cordial as possible) describing the issue and ask the residents to correct the problem voluntarily within 30 days. The association understands that things aren't always as they seem. So, any time we send notices to residents, I include my contact information for any questions or comments. We will always attempt to assist residents in bringing issue into compliance prior to imposing fines.
- Trees Please remember, your tree that was not an issue 20 or 30 years ago, is now 20 or 30 years older and larger, and with only 7' between your unit and the ribbon curb the trees canopy does not have much space before it has grown over the ribbon curb.
- Fruit Trees All fruit is to be removed from Citrus Trees by May 1st, with fines assessed after ten days. This is a fairly new rule in effect, and there seemed to be some confusion, so if you have any questions or would like a variance please contact the Administrative Office.
- Weeds The Association will send you notice per the Governing Documents, and if the weeds are not remedied within 30 days after notice, a Work Order is written for staff to remove weeds, and the owner will be billed. The rate for our Physical Properties staff is \$50.00 per hour per man, and I will advise you if the lot is left unattended it will easily take an hour to clean it.
- Palm Trees All Palm Trees on individual lots are the responsibility of the owner. The Association has all of the common area trees trimmed over the summer and receives discounted pricing because of the volume of trees. If you would like your Palm Tree included, and receive the same discounted rate as the Association please contact the Administrative Office.

I would like to thank the homeowners who have caretakers and implore those that do not, to do so, doing so respects your fellow homeowners and honors your commitment to the community. I suggest caretakers check your property regularly thru out the summer for weeds, water leaks, required trimming. We have a few residents in Carriage Manor that provide this service, please contact the Administrative Office for their names and contact information.

I wish you all safe travels on the journey back to your summer homes and be sure to check out what's happening at Carriage Manor while you are away at www.carriagemanorrv.com.

PHYSICAL PHACTS

I only ever witnessed my parents argue once. There was an evergreen bush in the front yard, outside the dining room window, that generated such emotion. My Father liked to get things done and my Mother liked them just right. This innocent bush had no idea the passion it generated. My Mother hated how the bush would block the morning sun in our split-level home. Many times, she would send my father out to snip a straggling branch or two. As patient of a man as he is, I imagine he reached his limit feeling he could never prune the bush to any kind of satisfaction. One day he just snapped, in his own way, and trimmed that bush so well that it was just a lonely stump. Thinking that finally solved the problem but mistakenly it generated passionate emotion between them. To this day we still question my father if he picks up the pruners.

Having shared that, I thought it a good idea to remind Residents to prune properly. Specifically speaking about plants around our Water Shut Off Valves. The Resort has many of them. They are spray- painted blue and may seem to be in random spots throughout the Resort. These markers identify critical infrastructure points when it comes to supplied water to each Resident. Trees and bushes need to be kept 3' away from these access points. In order for us to quickly turn off water, in an emergency, we need to take a large water key and turn it around quit a few times to close the valve. If there are trees and bushes in the way the Maintenance Team may have to creatively figure out how to spin the handle to close valve. Needless to say, thorny bushes and trees scratch up our hands and make the process more difficult.

Please check your plants and trim them away from the Resort's valves. It would be a great help......or I can see what my father's doing with his pruners? Just a thought.

Instructions:

All Residents (Owners & Renters)

This form is to be used anytime you check in for the season whether you rent or own. If you are an owner and you rent your place out, when the tenant leaves and you return, you you will need to update the Security Gate Form on every occasion. If, during your stay, you need to update access, you can fill out another form and return it to security who will update it in your records. There is a choice between having the access level designated "Restricted" or "Un-Restricted."

Restricted: Security will restrict (not allow access) to everyone except those guests who are listed on the Access Control Form. You have up to 6 names you can add to the "Names Allowed Access" portion of the form. If you want someone else to visit who is not on the list, you will need to call security prior to their arrival.

"Un-Restricted": If you check this box, security will grant access to any visitors/guests who arrive at the gate requesting to visit you.

This form does not apply to contractors! You will still need to call security prior to any contractors being granted access to your residence.

The Resident Access Form is available at the Administration Front Office.

The security department can be contacted 24 hours a day, seven days a week at 480-986-2467.










BOCCE CLUB





- 1. Drain pipes if possible
- 2. Shut off ALL faucets
- 3. DO NOT close or plug drains!
- 4. Pour a cup of antifreeze down every drain
- 5. Shut off water behind washing machine
- 6. Shut off water behind refrigerator
- 7. Shut of water to toilet and sinks
- 8. Verify/Install a shut off valve to every water source in the home

HIRE A CARETAKER

- 1. Check the home once a month
- 2. With flashlight look under sinks, around toilets and hot water tank for signs of water
- 3. Check the home within 24 hrs after storms
- *Before leaving for the summer get the names and numbers of 2 licensed and bonded contractors.
- *Make sure your Caretaker has your insurance agent's phone number.
