

RENTAL AD HOC COMMITTEE

The Rental ad hoc committee was created to look at the rental issues in Carriage Manor. We have been watching the trends in rentals in the area and the growing crisis regarding a shortage of rental units in the area. Did you know that the average rent in the Mesa area is \$1383.00? I know what you're thinking, that must be for a house with a yard. Guess again. The average size of an apartment is 829 square feet. If you've watched AZ family news lately you've seen reports on the desperation people are facing to secure a unit to rent. There just aren't enough rental units available to meet the demand, which is what drives the price up so high.

Our Ad Hoc committee has prepared three motions to be placed on the ballot, if approved by the board.

- 1) Move the minimum rental stay from 14 to 28 days.
- 2) Change the limit on the units one person can own from three to two
- 3) Change the CC&Rs to prohibit rentals in the months of June, July & August

That third one might sound confusing as we live in a resort and who'd want to rent here in Arizona? Let me explain. Roadhaven, Golden Vista, Sunland Village and Greenfield Village, and probably more than we haven't learned about yet, have all adopted policies of a minimum of 30 days rental and no rentals in June, July & August. They have done this to protect themselves from corporations buying up units in their resort and renting them out on a yearly lease.

I realize our HOA fee is going up to \$198 next year, but that is still a very low amount to pay each month for everything Carriage Manor Resort has to offer. So, you can see where the appeal is of a corporation buying three units and renting them out. Ka Ching!

BUT! If they can't rent them out for three months of the year that changes the whole scenario. This action is one that will keep us a "resort" instead of becoming just another trailer park. And if the other resorts have taken these measures and we don't, guess where they're going to be coming.

Please keep in mind we are **not** anti-renter. Renters bring new life and perspective to our resort and are often great volunteers and become future buyers in our community.

These proposed changes would be effective with the approval of the residents on the ballot and would **not be retroactive**. The new rule would apply to the new buyer, just like bringing physical properties up to ARC standards upon a transfer.

Recycling, Trash and Water Conservation

If you have just returned to Carriage Manor for the season, you may have noticed the absence of the green recycling bins. Valley cities, like communities nationwide, are not recycling as they used to for several reasons. China, traditionally our largest market for recyclables, has tightened contamination standards, processors increased fees and recyclables dropped in value as the quantity of recycled materials increased. We went from being paid for our recyclables to just having them hauled away to, finally, having to pay to get them hauled away and learning that they were ending up in the landfill. As this situation evolved, we reached a point where it cost less to simply put all our trash into the big roll-off dumpster and eliminate the recycling bins. The City of Mesa is working with ASU to research several possible long-term solutions for recycling, but for now there is no longer a pick up program. Note that Carriage Manor no longer has curb-side recycling pick up on Wednesdays as a result. Also note that the Tennis Club is still recycling aluminum beverage cans as a fund-raiser. Their blue plastic barrels are still being used for collection.

Now for some serious trash talk. As you can guess, the cost of disposal of our trash placed into the big dumpster continues to increase. Each time it is emptied there is a basic tipping fee of about \$200 and then \$65.00 per ton to which is added fuel/environment/regulatory surcharges at approximately 40%. To get "the most bang for our buck", it is important to minimize the wasted space that occurs when things like boxes and milk jugs are deposited without first flattening them. Let's not pay to dispose of air! Finally, we still have the kitchen garbage compactor. Bags placed in here should consist primarily of food prep and table scraps, including things like foam meat trays with absorbed juices.

Water; life cannot exist without it! With an extended Southwest drought and constantly booming Valley population, the cost of this resource has increased more than anticipated. The City of Mesa surprised us with not only an increase in the per-gallon water and sewer cost but also a delivery service fee. Since these cost increases were not expected, they were not incorporated into the budget. Future increases are likely as well. To help offset some of this increased cost, the CM Board of Directors has requested that the Long Range Planning Committee and its Resource Management and Conservation sub-committee investigate water usage in the resort and provide conservation recommendations for the Board's consideration. You can expect to receive email communications over the next few weeks containing facts and figures regarding our water use and cost, as well as water conservation suggestions and links to additional information on the internet. Please be sure the office has your current email address. Thank you for your conservation efforts. We can save a lot if we each do a little!

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
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CERAMICS CLUB



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
