Thank you to all of the volunteers for their efforts in assisting staff thru this past season and again, a sincere thank you to the Chapel for their \$1,500.00 donation to the resort.

CLA staff is already onsite to pull records and verify supporting documents to establish Carriage Manor's compliance with GAAP (Generally Accepted Accounting Principles). Upon completing thorough review of the Association's financial operations, CLA will present preliminary report this month, which will then go to the Budget and Finance committee for review and analysis as part of their report to the BOD. The BOD will be approving the final audit at their June 16th, 2022 meeting in order to comply with CC&R 7.8 D. *The annual financial report shall be made available to the members within (180) days after the close of the fiscal year.* Once approved, the audit will be posted on the website with copies available in the Administrative Office.

The Security Staff begins its Resort wide phased patrol of the doors/windows on all units, verifying and documenting they are secured. This is done several times thru out the summer, and all findings are compared to previous report for any variables, which are then researched and resolved.



PHYSICAL PHACTS

After dropping my Daughter off at the airport one Sunday morning I was enjoying a quiet drive home. No one was on the roads, as it was early. All of the sudden I heard a loud 'Boom' followed by 'hissing'. Sure enough I blew a tire. Traveling at 85mph, while this happened, I realize how much different it could of gone. I limped off the freeway, pulled into a parking lot and changed my tire. I was off and running without any complication other than a blown tire. When I go home I investigated the tire and found a thick piece of metal about the size of my finger that caused the disruption.

In May we will be starting up a Recycling Program through the City of Mesa. Their flyer was printed in April's Rumble sheet. Pretty self explanatory if one takes the time to read it. If any Resident chooses to participate in the program strict adherence to the rules will keep program running smoothly. If one chooses NOT to participate you will still be able to discard trash in Large Roll Off.

Any of the 4 items accepted for collection can go in any bin. The City of Mesa sorts and separates. Our responsibility is explained better in below steps.

-Residents choosing to participate are responsible to bring their accepted items to one of two recycling locations. (N of Tennis and W of Shuffleboard)

-Items CANNOT be left in bags

-Items must be washed and dry (thoroughly cleaned)

-Corrugated cardboard cut up to fit in bins. No Styrofoam

-All 4 accepted items can go in any bin. Flyers will be posted on bins so take the time to familiarize yourselves with what is accepted. **'When in doubt, keep it out'**

As you can see Recycling takes a bit of effort. To do it properly it takes even more. To take part in the City of Mesa's Recycling Program one must be dedicated to the cause. Again, if you choose not to recycle you have the other option.

Perhaps if we ALL recycled more there would be less loose metal lying on our Freeways causing tire malfunctions. Just about anything can be repurposed if done properly. It certainly causes one to think.

Mesa Recycling Program Changes These Categories Continue To Be A YES!



Beverage Bottles, Jugs and Cans

Empty, Clean and Dry Water bottles, milk jugs, soda bottles, soda cans, beer bottles, wine bottles, juice bottles, etc.



All Other Items NOT Accepted When In Doubt, Keep It Out.

Corrugated Cardboard

Remove ALL packaging &

break down large boxes

HOW TO TELL IF IT IS CORRUGATED:

Tear a small piece. If you see a flat top and bottom layer with a wavy middle layer, it is accepted.

No Longer Accepted:

- PLASTIC & PAPER CUPS
- PAPERBOARD BOXES: Cake mix, cereal, tissue, detergent, soda case, cracker, frozen food packaging, etc.
- MILK, JUICE & ICE CREAM PAPER CARTONS

How was the current list of accepted items determined?

Before items can be recycled, they must first be sorted at a materials recovery facility (MRF). Mesa's contracts with its MRF vendors ultimately determine what items can and cannot be accepted in Mesa's blue recycle barrel. MRFs are willing to accept and recycle items with a strong market value. Items that are accepted but contaminated, as well as non-accepted items, will be landfilled and the City will be charged significant disposal fees by the MRF. Therefore, our list has been updated to ensure we comply with all contract terms, avoid paying unnecessary fees and maintain the sustainability of Mesa's recycling program.

How is Mesa addressing recycling contamination?

Several major markets are no longer accepting material from the United States due to high levels of contamination and finding alternative markets has proven difficult. To ensure Mesa's material is free of contamination, daily random barrel inspections are conducted to help residents become better recyclers. However, when recycling

behaviors do not improve, the City will remove a resident's barrel to maintain the viability of the program. In some cases, immediate barrel removal may be necessary due to extreme non-compliance of the recycling program guidelines.

Besides recycling right, what else can I do to help manage our waste stream?

Metal Food

Cans

Empty, Clean and Dry

Vegetable, canned fruit,

tuna, pet food, tomato

sauce, soup, etc.

Reduce & Reuse. Generating less trash is always our BEST option. REDUCE by avoiding single-serving packaging which creates unnecessary waste. REUSE by avoiding one-time use products and instead opting for reusable ones, like a reusable water bottle.

CHIEF'S CHAT

Hello to everyone! We in the security department wish everyone a safe and wonderful summer in their prospective homes and with your family and friends. We will be having a full line up of work during the summer months.

We have begun the complete touring of the resort documenting and taking photos of bicycles throughout the resort. They will be placed in the files for the summer of 2022. We are also documenting which have been secured properly and which have not been secured. When we have completed that task, we will commence on the house-to-house checks, making certain that all homes are properly secured. In the event we find a property unsecured, the homeowner will be notified immediately. If you have a caretaker, we will notify them first, although the homeowner will be notified as well. We try to resolve the situation as quickly as possible and an incident report is always generated.

The inbound security arms have been working very well for the amount of usage they get. In the month of March the residents arm was exercised 22078 times. We observe folks approach the residents arm and it doesn't open for the them and the first thing stated is "What's wrong with the arm now"? Sometimes when approached too quickly the scanner cannot read the decal. Usually when asked to back-up and pull forward again it operates as designed.
