PHYSICAL PHACTS

The worst word I ever taught Child #2 was the word 'why'. Everything that happened in our lives, others lives and just our entire surround life, my daughter was there to ask the question. Why? Many of us know the ripple effects of teaching your kids things. There is truth in the saying, 'No good deed goes unpunished'. I can testify to that. To this day my skin crawls a bit when I hear the word. Now there was an upside, as there usually is with most things. My daughter always excelled well in school or whatever she tried, and to this day she is just a bit smarter than her dad. I would love to take the credit if my answers to her 'why' questions were spot on, but I am sure I made up a ton of stuff as I muddled through the answers. There truly are two sides of every coin, or in this case a choice. On the one side I have a highly intellectual child that I may have had a hand in and on the other side, if I hear the word 'why' again I will shoot myself.

Now let's take the water tree in the back of each of your homes. It is very common in many areas and climates to cover exposed piping with insulation to protect and maintain temperature. This act may be harmless, but it can have rippling effects that need attending too. Yeah, it is good to protect piping and control temperature, but out of sight, out of mind rarely works out for anyone. The water trees in the Resort are constructed with Galvanized piping. Covering that coating with pipe insulation will not prevent the effects of Arizona water. It would be very safe to say that inspections should be done periodically. As the maintenance team performs repairs on the tree water system, we find so much built up with hard water that you can't even see light through some of them. Pipe insulation or not, I have not seen much difference in their outcomes. Periodic inspections are a must. There is good with every bad and bad with every good and I am not sure pipe insulation is the best answer.

A better idea I have seen in the Resort that seems to work better is the plastic hollow rock. A step forward in the design would be some holes drilled in that plastic rock that would allow air to circulate. Allowing damaging moisture to dry out. A further step forward would be to inspect the pipes to your individual water trees pre-season and post-season, looking for moisture and build up, leaks, and possible problems. If you wanted to even jump aggressively further into the proactive realm, one could plan on replacing those pipes every 5 years or so and start fresh. Unfortunately, there is not a perfect answer for everyone, one must evaluate their variables, make a maintenance plan, and execute that plan.

Making choices is serious business. make them, own them and live with the consequences so you can keep making them.

CHIEF'S CHAT

Golf Cart Safety Tips:

Avoid Distractions – Stay focused on the road. No texting, no phone calls, no distracting conversations with passengers.

Obey Traffic Control Devices/Signage – Obey the speed limit (10 MPH), stop, and look both ways before proceeding at all stop signs, yield to pedestrians.

Keep Your Limbs Inside the Cart – Keep your arms, legs, and feet inside the cart unless you are signaling a turn.

Operate on Level Surfaces Only – Golf carts can easily "roll over" on uneven surfaces.

Do Not Drink and Drive - Golf cart operation must follow the same rules as vehicles.

High Beams – Some of the carts have lights that are very bright. This is blinding to oncoming traffic. Please turn your high beams off when approaching oncoming traffic. Or, your headlights may need to be adjusted.

Visibility – Ensure that your windshield is clean. Especially during times of sunup and sundown. A dirty windshield causes glare from the sun.

Remove Your Keys – Do not leave your keys in the ignition when not in use or unattended.

One of our residents forwarded a video to security showing a person "rifling through" a golf cart at 1am, the morning on 11/10/23. Nothing was taken, but a good reminder to everyone not to keep valuables unattended in their carts. This video was captured on the homeowner's personal security cameras.

Reminders:

Speed Limit is 10 MPH – Security is writing tickets.

Stop at all Stop Signs – I am seeing more and more residents rolling through the stop sign as you enter the resort after travelling through the gate arms.

Handicap Parking – Reminder that you do need a handicap placard or license plate to park in handicap parking. **Remember**, "SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING!" – Security direct line, 480-986-2467.

ELECTION BY ACCLIMATION

There will be an item on the 2024 ballot called "Election by Acclimation" and you might wonder (as I did) ...what's that?

This is a process designed to save time and money when it's election time.

An example of this is when there are three openings for the board of directors and there are only three candidates or less. It's a pretty done deal who's going to get elected, so this eliminates the need for the full ballot process.

There are many volunteer hours involved in removing those not eligible to vote, to prepare the ballots, make announcements to pick them up and then tracking down people to pick them up. After all the ballots are in they are tasked with counting the ballots and compiling the outcome. The ones that need to be mailed are expensive as it's a large package and even more expensive when it has to be sent to Canada. This would only go into effect when there are no other issues to be presented on the ballot. If there's anything also to be voted on such as by law shanges or now sen

ballot. If there's anything else to be voted on such as by-law changes or new construction then we need to do the full ballot process. It cannot be used for any of those kinds of changes.

For Carriage Manor to take advantage of this process, our attorney recommended simply removing the sentence that states "write-in candidates are allowed". That is a change in the by-laws and will need a vote of the people.

So, in February 2024 when you see one of the changes presented to remove the sentence allowing write-in candidates, now you'll understand why this came to be. Cheryl Keeffe
